Zakzak has contributed to dozens of studies and research papers on women's economic participation in Syria, women's empowerment, the gendering of constitutions and elections, gender-based violence in armed conflict, the feminist movement, and the worst forms of child labour in Syria. She has been a key contributor to shadow reports on CEDAW (2007 and 2014), the Convention on the Rights of the Child (2011), and the Beijing +10 and Beijing +30 review processes.

Ms. Suzan Aref

Ms. Suzan Aref is a human rights and civil society activist, and the founder and director of WEO since 2004. She served as the Coordinator of the Iraqi Cross-Sector Task Force 1325 from 2014 to 2019 and represented Iraq twice before the United Nations Security Council in 2018 and 2019 to present the status of women and the progress achieved in implementing Iraq's first National Action Plan (NAP) for UNSCR 1325. Ms. Aref was recognized by the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) as one of the 30 most prominent human rights defenders in the MENA region. In 2020, she was named among the world's most creative women for her leadership in promoting diversity and gender equality. She currently serves as an Advisor to Women7 (W7), the official women's engagement group of the G7.

Ms. Leila El Ali is a Palestinian Refugee feminist and political activist. She is a gender advisor and a promoter of Palestinian national and human rights with a particular focus on women. El Ali is the executive director of Association Najdeh, which is a development non-governmental organization that works with women and children in refugee camps and gatherings across Lebanon. Since 2014, Ms. Leila has been the Co-President of Euro Med Feminist Initiative (EFI). She has also been a member of the Advisory Committee of the Faculty of Arts at Beirut Arab University since 2017. El Ali is a central and national Palestinian member of the Palestinian Liberation Organization (PLO).

She served as Director General of Human Rights Affairs in the first Ministry of Human Rights, contributed to domestic violence legislation and the repeal of honor crime provisions, and continues to work as a legal advisor, gender policy expert, and regional contributor to UNSCR 1325 and the 2024 Regional Index on Violence against Women and Girls.</p>
